### Universal Credit Update

We are pleased to report that no more tenants will go onto Universal Credit (UC) between January 2018 and December 2018. This means if you stop

work or have any changes in benefits after December, you will not go onto UC.

The roll out of UC was due to happen in Glasgow in September 2018. This has been

delayed and will now not happen until December 2018 for Easterhouse residents.



### Local Housing Allowance Cap Update

We are pleased to report the Local Housing Allowance (LHA) cap for social housing, which was due to be introduced in April 2019, has been axed. This cap would have limited the amount of Housing Benefit or Rent Element of Universal Credit for single tenants under 35 with no dependent children. This means the possibility of tenants affected having to pay any shortfall in rent has now been removed.

- As a voluntary committee member you'll join hundreds of local people and other volunteers who play such a crucial role in taking forward the work of community controlled housing associations in Scotland.

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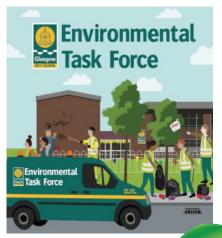

# Dog Fouling

**Residents continue** to be fed up with dog owners who do not clean up after their dog. Glasgow's Environmental Task Force is responsible for dealing with irresponsible dog owners who break



the law by not picking up their dog's mess. They can issue fines of between £80 up to £500 for repeat offenders.

However they can only take action if you and your neighbours report who is not picking up after their dog.

# **Technical Services Update**

# Auchinlea Road New Build

It will be an exciting year ahead with the new build development still on track for a Spring 2018 site start.

The Provanhall HA site, which is part of a larger Wheatley Group project, has a mix of cottage flats, semi-detached and terraced houses.

The Association is building 26 homes and these will be owned and managed by Provanhall HA.

# **New Close Doors**

As part of this year's planned maintenance programme, 13 closes in Auchinlea Road, Conisborough Road and Balcurvie Road got new close doors and new controlled entry systems. The tenants from the addresses involved are delighted with the new security measures and the new door design is a fantastic improvement.





# **Cold Weather Tips**

#### Keep your home warm

Try to keep your home warm day and night. If any area of your home does not have heating, for example rooms without radiators, leave doors open to allow heat to circulate.

### What to do if a pipe bursts

If the worst happens and a pipe busts please follow these simple do's and don'ts to reduce damage.

#### **Do**...

Turn off the water supply. The tap is usually under the sink or in the hall cupboard.

Switch off the electricity at the mains.

Switch off the boiler at the wall switch.

Use a bucket or basin to catch any water leaking from the burst.

Open all taps to the sink and bath. If possible collect the water in the bath for flushing the WC and washing.

Call the Association on 0141 771 4941 to report the repair.

#### Don't...

Ignore it, a small leak may be okay overnight but if left for several days could cause major damage in your and your neighbour's home.

### Emergency Repairs During Holidays
